- Falcon Millionaires Day Camp** hosted by Bowling Green State University
- PARENTS!** Looking for a unique summer camp opportunity for your kids? Bowling Green State University hosts this one-week financial literacy camp each summer in June. Current 7th graders who will be entering 8th grade in the fall are eligible. Campers learn how to save and invest to create long-term wealth and retirement options, work with businesses to develop problem-solving techniques, and begin to learn the importance of professional networking among many other skills.
- Fifth Third's Lives Empowered Through Financial Empowerment (LIFE)** Fifth Third's L.I.F.E. programs deliver financial education to people at all ages and stages of life. Their youth programs include the Young Bankers Club®, developed to teach basic financial concepts to students in fifth grade, and Foundations in Personal Finance®, an industry-leading financial education program for high-school juniors, developed and taught by teachers and aided by video lessons from Dave Ramsey. Their programs are taught in conjunction with local Fifth Third employee mentors and are free to all schools and students.
- Ohio Council for Economic Education (OCEE)** For over fifty years, the OCEE has worked with teachers, state officials, educational organizations and businesses to ensure that Ohio state curriculum includes meaningful standards for economic and financial education. OCEE and its affiliated centers work to promote and increase economic understanding among citizens of Ohio, primarily by assisting schools and teachers to develop the ability of student to make reasoned economic choices.
- National Endowment for Financial Education (NEFE)** NEFE's High School Financial Planning Program® (HSFPP) is a turnkey financial literacy program specifically focused on basic personal finance skills that are relevant to the lives of pre-teens, teens, and young adults. For thirty years this award-winning, free, non-commercial financial education program has been provided to millions of students in thousands of schools and community organizations throughout the country. This free resource does not require use of computers in the classroom.
- Smart Money Choices** Smart Money Choices offers information and resources for the general public that includes programs such as Smart Money Choices Direct, Smart Money Choices Speakers Bureau, and Citizen's Guide to Financial Wellness along with additional resources for adults, teens, and youth.

- Federal Deposit Insurance Corporation (FDIC)** FDIC's Money Smart for Young People is a curriculum series that align with educational standards and integrate financial education instruction into math, English and social studies. There are four curriculums available for download from Pre-K through 12th grade.
- Federal Reserve Bank of Cleveland** The Federal Reserve Bank of Cleveland is one of twelve regional Reserve Banks that offer students and teachers personal finance tools, tours and workshops.
- Financial Football** Visa and the National Football League have teamed up to help teach financial concepts with Financial Football, a fast-paced, interactive game that engages students while teaching them money management skills. Teams compete by answering financial questions to earn yardage and score touchdowns.
- Gen I Revolution** Developed for middle school and high school students, this online game gives your students the chance to learn important personal finance skills as they play and compete against fellow classmates.
- Jump\$tart Coalition** The Jump\$tart Coalition for Personal Financial Literacy is a coalition that shares an interest in advancing financial literacy among students in pre-kindergarten through college.

Students form competitive teams for an adventure through a dog park where they must purchase items for their dog and save as much money as possible, while encountering a mixture of risks and rewards along the way. The site also provides online resources for educators, high school and college students. The Stock Market Game The Stock Market Game (SMG) is a tool for educators to help students build a fundamental understanding of investing while providing them with real world skills practice in math, English language arts, economics, social studies, and other subjects. Take Charge Today Take Charge Today is program and curriculum with a decision-based approach to personal finance. Formerly Family Economics & Financial Education (FEFE), Take Charge Today provides a consistent framework for thinking through financial choices in order to improve well-being through ready-to-teach, activity based lesson plans.
